2) Result of the college:

The exam was conducted in March/April 2017 by Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University Aurangabad. Ghogre Anju Chandrakant scored 80.60 % marks in the examination. Ghogre Anju achieved first rank in the University and Ghogre Manju Chandrakant passed with second rank with 80.50 % marks. College's M.S.W. The agrigate result of fourth semester is 85.36 %. All those students, who performed well in written exam and fieldwork were congratulated by staff of college and Manavlok organization.

3) Student-teacher-parent-management meet:

Student-teacher-parent-management meet is organized every year in the college, after completion of M.S.W admission process. Newly admitted students and parents are given information about the rules of the university, discipline in the college, attendance in field work, report writing, revision etc. As a result, college attendance remains above 90 percent.

In this academic year Student-Teacher-Parent-Management meeting was held in the college on 11.09.2017. Dr. prakash Jadhav, Principal gave introductory speech. He gave information about all rules of the college especially about discipline, attendance, and code of conduct in the college campus. Mr. Ankush Maruti Jogdand from Bansarola Tahshil kage District Beed was the parents representative and president of this meet. Mr. Santosh Ruikar Tehsildar Ambajogai was the chief guest. Mr. Aniket Lohia explained the importance of cleanliness, Shramdan and khadi uniform to the parent's representative expressed their thoughts on this occasion.

4) Library:

On September 17, 2017, the book exhibition was inaugurated by the President's award-winning teacher Dr. Kamlakar Raut from Yogeshwari Nutan Vidyalaya, Ambajogai. On this occasion Dr. Dwarkadas Lohia, Founder Manavlok, Shri. M. V. Kakade Guruji, Dr. Prakash Jadhav Principal of the college, Dr. Arundhati Patil, Prof. Sukeshini Jogdand, Prof. Kisan Shingare, Prof. Hanumant Salunke, and social workers from Manavlok organization were present. New books in the library were displayed on this occasion.

As many as 5495 curricular and social science related reference books, novels, literature, encyclopedias are available in the college library. Apart from this, 30 magazines of various publications and 12 newspapers at national, state, divisional, district and local levels are available. The library has a separate reading room for students and faculty. Apart from this, an e-library has been arranged in the library. N-List Inflibnet and OPAC facility is available in the library to make e-book resources available to students and faculty. Apart from this, two computer sets are kept in the library for the convenience of the students. The head of the library and his colleagues try to make the library more useful and perfect. Students who have read more extra-curricular books throughout the year were felicitated with excellent reader certificates. Balaji Prahladarao Sreedole, Umakant Dattu Godam, Sandeep Dilip Londhe (MSW 2nd year) and Sachin Maruti Gaikwad, Mohan Antram Acharya, Ashok Hanumand Maind (MSW 1st year) received certificates as good readers.

5) Fieldwork:

Fieldwork is seen as the soul of social work education. Students studying social work need to be introduced to different social work organizations. So they can identity such institutional work and get inspire for social work. The objective of fieldwork is to create sensitivity towards the neglected, deprived, blind, disabled, mentally challenged, elderly, terminally ill, victims in the society. Orientation visits are organized to the institutions for the purpose of giving information to the students about the institutions working for the rehabilitation process.

A) Orientation visits-

Orientation visits were organized on 10th, 11^{th,} and 12th July 2017 at Infant India, Pali, Dist. Beed, Ashish Gram Rachna Trust Pachod Distt. Aurangabad, Patoda (Ideal village) Aurangabad, Gandhi Research Foundation Jalgaon Dist. Jalgaon and Jain Irrigation Jalgaon. 42 students of second year and 02 professor Dr. Arundhati Patil and Dr. Hanumant Salunke went for orientation visits of above organizations.

On 05th and 06th September 2017, orientation visits of first year students were organized at Civil Hospital of Ambajogai, Mandibazar, Ambajogai, Ahilya Devi Holkar Deaf and Dumb Girl's tResidential School, Manaswini Mahila Prakalp, Bodhvardhini Mentally Retrded

Children's School, Dnyanvardhini Handicapped School and Manavlok Organization.

B) Field work- In field work, the theoretical knowledge is demonstrated in the community and in various agencies of social work. Agency based field work is mainly focused on practicing case work method and group work method of M.S.W course. First year students are placed in various institutions while second year students are placed in communities for field work. The students adopted two methods of social work i.e. working with individuals and group work method. Under this approach, students have to study the problem of person and work of that organization. In fieldwork students are expected to study and practice the problem solving process. They shall use the principles, techniques, and methods of Social Case work. In the group work method, forming groups of people with similar problems and try to find the solution through group efforts is the main process of dealing with problem. Group work is done using group work principles, techniques, and skills.

Second year students have demonstrated the other methods of social work i.e working with community. Community organization method is used to address the major problems of the community. Understanding the community, identifying community problems and problem analysis, resource utilization and finding the solution to solve the particular problem is the process of implementation of this method. In this two-year course, efforts are made for the students to study all the six methods of social work. Students also participated in activities like agitation marches, submitting of statements to different government departments for the welfare of community, community based research etc.

On 01.07.2017 a meeting of fieldwork agency supervisors was organized in the college. 09 agency supervisors were present for the meeting. Under fieldwork practicum activities 20 series of programs were conducted for the students of class IX on the topic of "Adaptation of changes in adolescent age...". They learned about physical and mental development, health issues, sexual abuse, concept of beauty, media, friendship, gender sensitization, goal setting and coping with stress, etc. The series was conducted in collaboration with Dyan Prabodhini Research Center, Pune sponsored by Central Commission for Women, New Delhi.

6) Rural Camp:

Manavlok's College of Social Work, Ambajogai organized rural camp for the MSW II semester students. It is a compulsory 5 days activity given in the syllabus. This camp provides opportunities to students about experiences of rural life analyze rural dynamics and observe the local self-government and voluntary organizations. It also

helps to develop skills, study the government schemes and report their experiences. Rural camp was organized in eight villages for first year students.. Economic and social survey of eight selected villages was conducted for the students under this camp. Apart from this, the rural camp was organized according to various aspects like understanding the rural areas, economy, social system and local administration, identifying the needs of the people, ranking the needs. Rural Participatory Appraisal (PRA) was conducted in a total of eight villages selected under Shibira. In this process, demonstrations were conducted on Village Social Map, Shiwar Pheri, Chapati Diagram, Property Valuation etc. College professors and institute workers participated in this process.

Rural camp for first year students was organized from 03rd to 07th March 2018 at Mauje Dagadwadi Tahshil Ambajogai Dist- Beed. This rural camp was inaugurated by Panchayat Samiti member Shri. Satish Kendre. Reporter of Dainik Sakal Mr. Prashant Bardapurkar, former sarpanch Jalinder Padule and Dr. Prakash Jadhav Principal of Manavlok Social Work College present in this program. In this rural camp, the students got opportunity to learn about the quality of life of people in rural areas, rural culture, health of women and children, problems of adolescent girls, water management etc. A survey was conducted in the village by the students. The social and economic condition of the village was studied through the survey. Dr. Rama Pande took a gathering of adolescent girls and guided them on health and hygiene. Dr. Nazir Sheikh demonstrated on PRA: Rural Appraisal made through Public Participation. Information was given to the villagers and students about water management. In the concluding session of the rural camp Dr. Dwarkadas Lohia Founder Manavlok, Shri. Shankar Ubale, Principal Dr. Prakash Jadhav, Mr. Lalasaheb Agale, Joint secretary of Manavlok, Mrs. Gangatai Kundgar Sarpanch Dagwadi, Srinivas More Headmaster of Z.P School, Tejaswini Ujagare Gram Sevak, and Mr.Avinash Mudegaonkar was present. Kisan Shingare Assistant Professor was the cordinator and Dr. Hanumant Salunkhe worked as co coordinator of this camp.

7) Study Tour:

Study Tour is the part of syllabus. In the academic Year 2017-18, Sudy tour was conducted for second year students in which 27 boys and 12 girls, thus total 39 students were participated. It was held from 15 February 2018 to 24 February 2018. The purpose of the study tour was to get information about the activities of NGOs and government organizations outside Maharashtra. A study tour was organized to visit the following institutions to know the importance of historical places, geographical position, difference between culture and ideology in Maharashtra and other states, standard of living, cropping pattern, water management etc.

8. Department of Lifetime Education and Extension:

Since 2003, the college has been imparting intellectual knowledge along with vocational knowledge to the college students through Lifelong Learning and Extension Department, under the Extension Education Department of the University. The following programs were conducted in this academic year college.

On behalf of the Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension Services, a workshop was conducted on "Gender and Sexuality". This workshop was conducted on 20/09/2017. Gauri Bobde, Sushma Kharade, Sadhana Sawant from TATHAPI TRUST Pune guided the students.

On behalf of the Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension Services the workshop was organized on 26.09.2017. Smt. Anghatai Lovelekar from Dynan Prabodhini Jalana, Pragya from Manas Sanshodhika, Pune gave their guidance on "Therapetic intervention and areas of application".

On behalf of the department Workshop on Vocational Guidance was conducted on 10.03.2018. In this workshop Mr. Kashinath Bhatgunaki, Dream Foundation Solapur guided M.S.W students.

Student counseling guidance workshop was conducted on 14.03.2018. Archana Joshi, Manjusha Raut, Varsha Bhave Aurangabad were the resource persons. They gave their valuable guidance to M.S.W students.

Department of Lifelong Education and Extension Services received an amount of Rs. 2000/- from Dr. From Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University Aurangabad to implement the social work program for the year 2017-18. Dr. Rama Pande observed the work as a Program Officer. The programs were held at college as well as community level. Report of Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension Services submitted to Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University Aurangabad.

9. Block Placement Training:

Block placement training is a mandatory part of the social work study. M.S.W second year students are placed in different reputed NGOs for Block Placement Training. Students are assigned tasks for one month's hands-on experience. They rae expected to study the activities of NGOs, donors, donor agencies and an organization. They get an experience of administrative work.

10. Student Welfare Department-

• Earn and Learn Scheme:

Since 2014, Vasantraoji Kale Swabhiman Education Scheme (Earn and learn) has been implemented by Student Welfare Department of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University Aurangabad. The scheme is implemented by 50 percent share of the university and 50 % share of the college.

Amount of Rs 5000/- was received under Late.Vasantrao Kale Swabhiman Education (Earn and Learn) Scheme of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University Aurangabad. A new banner of "Earn and Learn" was installed on the board in the college campus.

Sainath Ankush Jogand, Mehtap Singh Katarsingh Bhabardode, Amol Popat Navgire, Asha Sishivaji Shinde, Balasaheb Anantrao Kadam were selected under the Earn and Learn scheme. Each of them was given honorarium cheque of Rs. 1500/-.The report on Earn and Learn Schenme was submitted to Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad. Prof. Sukheshini Joganda looks after the work as a coordinator of this program.

11.Cultural Department:

A) Get-together program: The Get-together program was was held on 22nd, 23rd, and 24th March 2018. Cricket, Valibales, Music Chairs, Dresses, Shelapagote, Atakshari Competition etc. events were held. All the students of MSW first and second year were actively involved in this program. The prize distribution program was organized. Various programs including folk songs, bharud, gondhal, group songs, poems, singing, dance etc. were held. This initiative helps to increase we-feeling among students.

B) Youth Festival – Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University Aurangabad organized SRUJAN Mahotsav (Central Youth Festival) from October 29, 2017 to November 01, 2017. 17 students participated in 07 different art forms. Dr. Hanuant Salunkhe was the coordinator for our college group participated in Central Youth Festival at University.

12. Different committees:

A) Anti-Ragging Committee - The Anti-Ragging Committee has been set up as per the Maharashtra Government Act to ensure that the new entrants do not suffer any mental or physical harm from the above students. Since it is a college that teaches social work, there are no forms of ragging in college. The rites of non-discrimination are practiced in the college on the basis of gender equality, socio-economic inequality. To date, no such complaint has been lodged with the committee. As the chairman of the committee, Dr. Arundhati Patil looks after the work.

B) Internal Complaints Committee - As per the bill passed in the Lok Sabha in 2013, a committee has been set up in the college for prevention of sexual harassment against women. Dr. Arundhati Patil works as a coordinator of the committee.

C) Internal Quality Assurance Cell – IQAC has been established in the college for quality enhancement. Efforts are made to enhance the quality of the college by exploring internal and external resources. As the coordinator of this committee, Prof. Dr. Rama Pande look after this work. In the academic year 2014-2015, the college was evaluated under NAAC. In order to enhance the internal quality of the college and the students, the committee held 06 meetings from time to time and carried out the instructions and facilities as demanded. Career Mentoring Camps, Competitive Examination Camps, and Mentoring Camps on Study Related Topics were organized for the students. On behalf of this committee, minorities, backward classes, students who are lagging behind in studies, special needs students (disabled) were assisted.

D) Social Justice and Empowerment Committee -

As per the directives of the University Grants Commission, NAAC and Higher EducationDepartment of the Government of Maharashtra, a "Social Justice and Empowerment Committee" have been established in the college for the benefit of the students belonging to the Scheduled Caste, Sheduled Tribes, Nomadic Tribes and Other Backward Classes. This committee has seven members among them four members are student representatives. The Principal is the chairman of the committee. As a teacher's representative Prof. Sukeshini Jogdand is selected.

31. Guest Lecture

A guest lecture was organized on 25.09.2017, for M.S.W IInd year students on the subject of **Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2000/2015**. Mr. Datta Nalawade, President, Child Welfare Committee, Beed gave his valuable guidance to M.S.W students.

32. Co-curricular Activity:

Case Presentation:

Learning supportive activity is a part of syllabus for M.S.W first year students. Under this activity students are given various social problems in the society like education, water management, drought, social justice and equality, various social laws etc. 45 issues were allotted to students for study. After studying the above subject, the students have presented a detailed report in the college. 07 excellent reports were published as special issues in the 'Gajar'

Seminar:

Orientation visits are important to understand the institution and their social work. First year students are given visits to local government and semi-government institutions. Second year students are given visits to government and semi-government institutions, industries, ideal villages in the state of Maharashtra. At this time, the students study the day-to-day functioning, management, and working methods of the organizations. After the visit, the students are presented group wise seminar on the function of visited institutions.

Field Action:

• Nature School (Nisarg shala): M.S.W. students during their field work at brick kiln area of Raviwar Peth, found that the children of brick kiln workers did not have access of school. The school dropout rate is high among these children. In order to facilitate the education of these students from brick kiln worker's families. The program was conducted under the guidance of Dr.Rama Pande, Shubham Didwani, Asha Shinde, Balaji Sridole, Sadhana Bansode conducted Nisarg shala. A group of school dropout students gathered under a tree and learning process was implemented in fieldwork. Hence the school was called Nisarga Shala. 35 boys and girls benefitted from this school. Due to the popularity of this work, Yogeshwari cable network broadcasted the news on this

work. District Education and Training Institute Ambajogai took note of the said work and 15 to 20 government officials and employees visited this nature school and appreciated this needbased program.

Bridge Construction: M.S.W. Second year students do field work in Sadar Bazar community. In the fieldwork students observed that there ia a weak and distructed bridge in Sadar bazaar, people from Kaikadi Galli community were using this broken bridge. They were demanding its repairmen since long time but municipal coporation neglected. Students noticed that in future it may cause for big accident. Students used Social Action Method and organized community dwellers under the guidance of Prof. Sukeshini Jogdand. On 09.03.2018 at 11.00 am, people started protest against municipal administration. As a result of this protest, the municipal administration gave a written assurance that the work of the broken bridge over the canal at Kaikadi Galli would be started within the next eight days. In this movement, the founder of Manavlok Dr. Dwarkadas Lohia was actively present and guide people. A large number of women, youth and senior citizens of Sadar Bazar participated in this movement. Akshay Kumar Gore, Umakant Godam, Monica Shingare, Priyanka Pandey, Vinod Dasud, Lakhan Sirsat made this social action successful under the guidance of Prof. Sukeshini Jogdand

33. Extra Activities:

- **Paralegal Volunteers:** On 18.07.2017, Manavlok Social Work College in association with Taluka Vidhi Committee of Law and Justice Department held a workshop on 'Rights of Children / Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children)'. Mr.Deshpande, Mr. Joshi, JMFC, Adv. Ashok Kulkarni, Adv. Kalyani Virdhe were participated in this program. They gave their valuable guidance on various legal aspects of this topic.
- Lok Adalat Public Awareness Rally: A rally was organized on 24.08.2017 by the second year students with the objective of making the people aware of the importance of Lok Adalat. The purpose of Lok Adalat is that the court cases should be settled immediately. The rally was conducted from Civil Court area via Shivaji Chowk to Mandibazar, Patil Chowk, S.T. stand, and back to Civil Court Ambajogai. The college students performed a street play on legal awareness. All the judges and office staff of the lawyers' association were present in large numbers.
- **Installation:** The program of Installation was Conducted on 06.09.2017 for MSW 2nd year students with a view to impart academic development along with skill development. Five groups were made in this program. Each group was given a separate topic. Topics like cleanliness, superstition, watershed, farmer suicide, education etc. were given. The students made an installation on the above topic using the available equipment in the college premises and gave a group presentation.
- **Bhumika:** Along with the curriculum, various activities and presentations are organized for the students in the college every Thursday. An innovative initiative called 'Bhumika' is published on the first Thursday of every month. In this program, students are expected to write their opinions, thoughts, and perspectives on current affairs, social, political, economic, cultural issues/problems/situations. On this occasion, the college has provided a good opportunity to the students to express their thoughts in written form.In the academic year, an in 2017-18 innovative activity of 'Bhumika' was conducted in which the students chose a topic on the current social problem and presented it

in detail. Students choose a topic on a current social problem and present it in detail on the fourth Thursday of every month by five students separately in front of all the professors and students of the college. Due to this activity, students started reading new books and using statistical information.

- Skill Development: A skill development program was conducted for the first year students, on 26th January 2018 on the occasion of Republic Day. Dr. Nazeer Sheikh tried to impart education through entertainment and games. This includes students' concentration, teamwork, playfulness etc. Subject information was given with demonstration. Skill development is mainly used for community organization.
- Awareness Songs: On the second Thursday of the month, Janajagrutipar Geet is conducted in the college. The students are made aware of the patriotic song. It gives them inspiration, enthusiasm and inculcate social values of life. The songs which express the life of farmers, labourers preferred. On the second Thursday of the month, 05 students from the first and second years sing awareness songs.
- Shramdan: Shramdan is organized in the college every Thursday from 10:30 am to 11:30 am in order to inculcate the culture of hard work among the students and to understand the importance of cleanliness. All the students of the college, all the employees of the college participate in Shramdana. Cleaning of the premises, cleaning of the bathroom is carried out.
- Khadi Uniform: According to Dr.Dwarkadas Lohia, the founder of Manavlok, all social workers of the organization as well as all the employees and students of the college should wear khadi uniform on every Monday and Thursday, in respect of leaborers working in Khadi manufacturing.
- **Prayer:** College starts at 10:25 am with prayer. At this time, all the student and staff stands in a row and take the prayer written by Saneguruji, 'Khara to Ekchi Dharma, Jagala Prem Arpave'. This activity helps to maintain discipline and values are inculcate among participants.

• Parivartan Project:

05 elderly people were distributed kits through Parivartan Prakalp. Bibhishan Ghadge, Ramdas Kale, Ashok Kedart participated in this program.

• Tree Plantation: Manavlok Social Work College and Vrukshapremi Mitra Pariwar Ambajogai jointly organized tree plantation program in July 2017. Total 60 trees were planted at Geetha Road area. Mr. Kirdant Sir, Dr. Sheikh Nazir, Dr. Hanumant Salunke, Sadashiv Malwad, Walekar, Shri. Nikam sir, Girwalkar sir, social workers from Manavlok organization and M.S.W students were participated.

Social work concepts and ideologies

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Human society is a network of relationships. This web of relationship is becoming more complex day by day. Every person needs social, economic, and mental stability. Physical and mental needs are fulfilled by the society itself. So the individual is dependent on the society and alternatively the society is dependent on the individual. A person develops mentally and emotionally through socialization. A competent person is the strength of the society as well as the country. Recently, problems seem to be increasing due to complex socio-economic conditions. It is almost impossible to find a person without problems.

Our country has got a great cultural heritage. It is said that, natural mechanism for solving the problems and needs of the individual existed in the family and society. Due to this, the process of adjustment of children, widows, disabled, old people were being carried out through this system. It was based on religious philosophy. Emphasis was given on the concept of sin and virtue to inculcate love, charity and service. But in the middle ages, rituals became important. Religion was used to make people ignorant, uneducated. This period is also known as Tamoyug. Untouchability was observed in the society. There were many restrictions on the Roti-Beti transaction. Restrictions were placed on business. From Sant Dyaneshwara to Chokha Mela, the sufferings of gentlemen are well-known. Superstition and ignorance reached its peak. Due to the vice of discrimination between people, it became difficult for the common man to live. Women were restricted in their house. Social development was completely stunted, that's why it was possible for foreign powers to establish themselves here. Foreigners used their power only for exploitation. During this period, the society continued to decline.

The British adopted the percolation theory of education to create workers suitable for their system. But this education became the breeding ground of the social reformers who brought the country out of the Tamoyuga. The early social reformer Raja Ram Mohan Roy studied the Vedas and worked tirelessly to pass the Act of 1829, proving that inhuman Satiprayo was not a religious order. Mahatma Phule attacked all the social stereotypes of the then society, raised the issue of agricultural laborers before the system, suggested social reforms, and implemented his philosophy in the form of truth-seeking society. Opened the doors of education to the common man, established a home for the prevention of feticide, and took steps ahead of time. While awakening the conscience, the mentality of slavery was severely attacked. The farmers were drawn against the exploiters. Sant Tukdoji Maharaj gave the basic mantra for village development through Gramgita. Gramadhudhi, village development, village protection, village health, village education, village industry, village organization are discussed in the book Gram Gita. Maharshi Dhondo Keshav Karve, Vitthal Ramji Shinde, Dr. The legacy of many great social reformers like Dr.Babasaheb Ambedkar, Ramabai Ranade, Pandita Ramabai, Savitribai Phule etc. has benefited the social work faculty.

In today's modern society many new problems have arisen along with old problems are increasing day by day. Urbanization has given rise to slums. Industrialization has led to migration. The agriculture industry is in crisis due to drought. The youth is in a confused state due to unemployment. It is necessary to provide emotional support to the troubled person. If a person is made aware of their own abilities, they can overcome the problem. It is now widely accepted that counseling is legitimate for the adjustment of maladjusted people. Social work is being accepted as a profession today. When a person is unable to solve his own problems, he needs the help of social workers. A social worker with his knowledge and skills helps the troubled person to get out of that situation and become self-reliant. To present the issues of the society before the system requires good knowledge of the situation, communication skills, and leadership qualities. Education to develop these skills and create such activists is imparted by the Faculty of Social Work. We see that efforts are being made at the individual, institutional and government level to solve the problems of poverty, ill health, unemployment, violence, social crime, corruption, drought, addiction and to bring about development in the society. Knowledge at all these levels requires workers with social awareness and situational awareness. Today, torture is working in many fields along with the government. In fact, there will be no sector in the near future where the government will not have to seek the help of NGOs. Many career opportunities have been made available to the young women who have received social work education in Bait, both at the government level and in the corporate sector.

As Alice Cheney says in social work, social benefits are provided to individuals, groups and communities by adopting classical knowledge and classical methods. Also, continuous efforts are made to improve the social relations of the individual. Of course, social work is important in classical method and prudent thinking. Therefore, in the true sense, education is given to develop human beings and develop humanism in the faculty of social work.

In Aurangabad, a student killed himself by jumping from the third floor while the coffee was ripening, the strange decisions of the caste panchayat in Kantrarbhat society, virginity testing, suicides of weed-affected farmers, tribal conflicts, underlining the importance of social work education that teaches the importance of counseling to help the troubled in a classical way in all these contexts. The aim of social work education is to produce knowledgeable and skilled workers who will bring social change. It has become the need of the hour to make such activists to establish humanism in the society.

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
