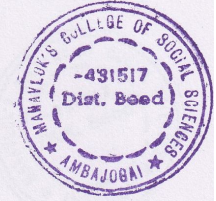

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### 1) Admission:

In the academic year 2018-2019, the admission process implemented as per the rule and regulations of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad. The meeting regarding admission procedure was held on 29<sup>th</sup> May, 2018 and schedule of the admission procedure was made as following-

### 2) Result of the college:

The exam was conducted in March / April 2019 by Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University Aurangabad. The aggregate result of fourth semester is 94.73 %. All those students, who performed well in written exam and fieldwork, were congratulated by staff of college and Manavlok organization.

### 3) Student-teacher-parent-management meet:

Student-teacher-parent-management meet is organized every year in the college, after completion of M.S.W admission process. Newly admitted students and parents are given information about the rules of the university, discipline in the college, attendance in field work, report writing, revision etc. As a result, college attendance remains above 90 percent.

In this academic year Student-Teacher-Parent-Management meeting was held in the college on 28.07.2018. Dr. Prakash Jadhav, Principal gave introductory speech. He gave information about all rules of the college especially about discipline, attendance, and code of conduct in the college campus. He also explained the importance of cleanliness, Shramdan and khadi uniform to the parents and students. Dr. Arun Dalve , Principal, Vasundhara Mahavidyalaya, Ghatnandur was the chief guest of this program. He gave his valuable students about the importance of education and how youth can contribute for social change.

#### **4) Library:**

There are 5522 various curricular and social science related reference books, novels, literature, encyclopedias are available in the college library. Apart from this, 30 magazines of various publications and 12 newspapers at national, state, divisional, district and local levels are available. The library has a separate reading room for students and faculty. Apart from this, an e-library has been arranged in the library. N-List Inlibnet and OPAC facility is available in the library to make e-book resources available to students and faculty. Apart from this, two computer sets are kept in the library for the convenience of the students. The head of the library and his colleagues try to make the library more useful and perfect. 26 new books are purchased in this academic year. Dr. D.S.Lohiya presented 07 books to the library.

#### **5) Fieldwork:**

Fieldwork is seen as the soul of social work education. Students studying social work need to be introduced to different social work organizations. So they can identify such institutional work and get inspire for social work. The objective of fieldwork is to create sensitivity towards the neglected, deprived, blind, disabled, mentally challenged, elderly, terminally ill, victims in the society. Orientation visits are organized to the institutions for the purpose of giving information to the students about the institutions working for the rehabilitation process.

##### **A) Orientation visits-**

M.S.W first year's orientation visits were organized on 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> July 2018 at various schools in Ambajogai city. M.S.W second year's orientation visits were organized at Social Welfare Department office Parbhani, Ugam Organization Kalamnuri, Tribal Community Boldawadi, Tribal school Jaygavhan and Collector office Hingoli. Along with students Dr. Najir Sheikh, Dr. Arundhati Patil and Dr. Hanumant Salunke went for orientation visits of above organizations.

**B) Field work-** In field work, the theoretical knowledge is demonstrated in the community and in various agencies of social work. Agency based field work is mainly focused on practicing case work method and group work method of M.S.W course. First year students are placed in various institutions while second year students are placed in communities for field work. The students adopted two methods of social work i.e. working with individuals and group work method. Under this approach, students have to study the problem of person and work of that organization. In fieldwork students are expected to study and practice the problem solving process. They shall use the

principles, techniques, and methods of Social Case work. In the group work method, forming groups of people with similar problems and try to find the solution through group efforts is the main process of dealing with problem. Group work is done using group work principles, techniques, and skills.

Second year students have demonstrated the other methods of social work i.e working with community. Community organization method is used to address the major problems of the community. Understanding the community, identifying community problems and problem analysis, resource utilization and finding the solution to solve the particular problem is the process of implementation of this method. In this two-year course, efforts are made for the students to study all the six methods of social work. Students also participated in activities like agitation marches, submitting of statements to different government departments for the welfare of community, community based research etc.

## **6. Rural Camp:**

Manavlok's College of Social Work, Ambajogai organized rural camp for the MSW II semester students. It is a compulsory 5 days activity given in the syllabus. This camp provides opportunities to students about experiences of rural life analyze rural dynamics and observe the local self-government and voluntary organizations. It also helps to develop skills, study the government schemes, and report their experiences. Rural camp was organized in eight villages for first year students.. Economic and social survey of eight selected villages was conducted for the students under this camp. Apart from this, the rural camp was organized according to various aspects like understanding the rural areas, economy, social system and local administration, identifying the needs of the people, ranking the needs. Rural Participatory Appraisal (PRA) was conducted in a total of eight villages selected under Shibira. In this process, demonstrations were conducted on Village Social Map, Shiwar Pheri, Chapati Diagram, Property Valuation etc. College professors and institute workers participated in this process.

Rural camp for first year students was organized from 28<sup>th</sup> January to 1<sup>st</sup> February 2019 at Mauje Radi Tahshil Ambajogai Dist- Beed.

'Awareness about Water Literacy to cope up with Drought' was the main theme of this rural camp. Prof. Sukeshini Jogdand and Dr. Hanumant Salunkhe coordinated the camp. Team of PANI FOUNFATION gave their valuable guidance on water literacy and watershed management. Sameer Pathan, Sopan Poul from Manavlok guide on Gournd water management and water budget. Shri. Vitthal Nagargaje, BDO, Ambajogai inaugurated this rural camp. Mr. Lalasaheb Agale Joint Secretary was present on this occasion.

## **7. Study Tour:**

Study Tour is the part of syllabus. In the academic Year 2018-2019, Sudy tour was conducted for second year students in which 33 students were participated. The purpose of the study tour was to get information about the activities of NGOs and government organizations outside Maharashtra. A study tour was organized to visit the following institutions to know the importance of historical places, geographical

position, difference between culture and ideology in Maharashtra and other states, standard of living, cropping pattern, water management etc.

Hello Medical Foundation Andur, Helpers of the Handicaped Kolhapur, Sawantwadi, Malwan, Goa etc places were visited.

## **8. Department of Lifelong Education and Extension:**

### **WORKSHOP ON RUBELA CAMPAIGN**

This workshop was conducted in the college premises on dated 10/09/2018. Dr. Laxman More from Civil Hospital Ambajogai was the resource person, who delivered his lecture on ReBELA Campaign which will be started from Nov. 2018. He appealed all the M.S.W. students to participate in this National Campaign. This programme was concluded by the vote of thanks by Prof. KisanShingare.

### **HEALTH CHECKUP PROGRAMME**

This programme was organized in Zilha Parishad School, Parlives and Dr. Ram Bhalchandra Vidyalaya, Raviwar Peth on dated 28-09-2018. Dr. Chavan madam and her team made health checkup camp for students. In this health camp 45 students from Z.P. school Parlives and 177 students from Dr. Ram Bhalchandra Vidyalaya Rawivar Peth were benefited.

### **WATER LITERACY WORKSHOP**

This workshop was held on 05-09-2019 **Objectives**

To make know the students about the importance of Water literacy and to motivate for the participant in this movement.

This workshop was organized with the association of Pani Foundation, Marathwada. In this workshop the resource persons were focused on the importance of Water literacy and techniques for water saving.

The workshop conducted in two sessions and the resource persons were SantoshShingare, ShivrajBagal, SuvarnakarBalasaheb, Nagargoje and Adsule.

### **ISLAM FOR ALL**

This programme was conducted on 20-01-2019 at 2 pm in the college premises in association with Dr. Waled Ali and Mujeeb Quazi, president of Jamate A Islam Hind, Ambajogai. President of this function was Dr. Prakash Jadhav, Principal Manavlok Social Work College Ambejogai. The resource person delivered his lecture on the importance of Islam for mankind. All the teaching and non teaching staff and students attended this programme.

## **NATIONAL SEMINAR ON WATER LITERACY**

Manavlok Social Work College organized one day national seminar on “Youth and Water Literacy” in association with Manavlok Ambajogai and Yashda Pune, on 5<sup>th</sup> February 2019. Academicians, research scholars and social workers participated in seminar and submit their articles.

This national seminar was mainly organized for Jalnayak, JalYodhha, JalSevak, JalDoot and Jalpremi working for water conservation and sustainable development of the society. The ‘One Day National Seminar on Youth and Water Literacy’ was inaugurated at 9.30 am. by Dr. Rajendrasingh Rana, Waterman of India. Social activists shared their experience and thoughts on water related issues. The national seminar was concluded at 7.00 pm.

Dr. Rajendrasingh Rana in his valuable guidance said that the concept of development must be changed. He explained the causes of low rain fall and water scarcity in Maharashtra as well as in India. I have seen rivers change colours through the day, during my childhood. He said that, I would love for future generations to experience nature in such pristine conditions. People have forgotten the rivers of their childhood. Students have the power to change this scenario. Students shall invest an hour of their day on their health and an hour on water conservation. He is certain that farmers need to give up sugarcane farming, which gives them a single yield in a year, and instead look for multiple yields in a year. He has been trying to convince farmers to go for tur dal and soya bean. He also says the drought in Maharashtra is “man-made”.

## **PROGRAMME ON WATER CONSERVATION**

This programme was organized on dated 06-02-2019 in the college premises and the resource person was Shri Baburao Kendre from Nanded District. He was welcomed by Prof. Kisan Shingare. In his valuable guidance he told his life journey briefly and expressed his experiences of water conservation campaign. He said that women from his village had to bring water from four to five kilometers long distance from their house. He said that he tried much to lessen the problem of water scarcity. Thus he focused on importance of water conservation which is the need of the day.

## **CAPACITY BUILDING FOR YOUTH**

This programme was conducted on 24<sup>th</sup> January 2019. Mrs. Sunita Bagal was the resource person and Dr. Prakash Jadhav was president of this function.



In her lecture she explained about skills which should acquire by the professional social workers. The important factor which are known to Social Workers such as knowledge, skill, information, presentation, multi -asking, confidence and attitude. These factors helps the person a specially social worker to fulfill his work effectively.

### **9) Block Placement Training:**

Block placement training is a mandatory part of the social work study. M.S.W second year students are placed in different reputed NGOs for Block Placement Training. Students are assigned tasks for one month's hands-on experience. They rae expected to study the activities of NGOs, donors, donor agencies and an organization. They get an experience of administrative work. Students placed in different 14 social work organization. The duration of BPT was from 5<sup>th</sup> May 2018 to 4<sup>th</sup> June 2018.

### **10) Cultural Department:**

**Get-together program:** The Get-together program was was held on 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> March 2019. Cricket, Valibales, Music Chairs, Dresses, Shelapagote, Atakshari Competition etc. events were held. All the students of MSW first and second year were actively involved in this program. The prize distribution program was organized. Various programs including folk songs, bharud, gondhal, group songs, poems, singing, dance etc. were held. This initiative helps to increase we-feeling among students. Shree Ankushrao Kaldate was present on this occasion.

### **11) Various committees:**

**A) Anti-Ragging Committee** - The Anti-Ragging Committee has been set up as per the Maharashtra Government Act to ensure that the new entrants do not suffer any mental or physical harm from the above students. Since it is a college that teaches social work, there are no forms of ragging in college. The rites of non-discrimination are practiced in the college on the basis of gender equality, socio-economic inequality. To date, no such complaint has been lodged with the committee. As the chairman of the committee, Dr. Arundhati Patil looks after the work.

**B) Internal Complaints Committee** - As per the bill passed in the Lok Sabha in 2013, a committee has been set up in the college for prevention of sexual harassment against women. Dr. Arundhati Patil works as a coordinator of the committee.

**C) Internal Quality Assurance Cell – IQAC** has been established in the college for quality enhancement. Efforts are made to enhance the quality of the college by exploring internal and external resources. As the coordinator of this committee, Prof. Dr. Rama Pande look after this work. In the academic year 2014-2015, the college was evaluated under NAAC. In order to enhance the internal quality of the college and the students, the committee held 06 meetings from time to time and carried out the instructions and facilities as demanded. Career Mentoring Camps, Competitive Examination Camps, and Mentoring Camps on Study Related Topics were organized

for the students. On behalf of this committee, minorities, backward classes, students who are lagging behind in studies, special needs students (disabled) were assisted.

#### **D) Social Justice and Empowerment Committee –**

As per the directives of the University Grants Commission, NAAC and Higher Education Department of the Government of Maharashtra, a “Social Justice and Empowerment Committee” have been established in the college for the benefit of the students belonging to the Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribes, Nomadic Tribes and Other Backward Classes. This committee has seven members among them four members are student representatives. The Principal is the chairman of the committee. As a teacher's representative Prof. Sukeshini Jogdand is selected.

A letter is sent to Commissioner, Aurangabad and Assistant Commissioner, Beed for including the taluka level colleges in to Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Swadhyaya Yojana. Application of 04 students is also submitted to Assistant Commissioner Social Welfare, Beed

#### **12) Employment Guidance Cell:**

On behalf of this cell, students and alumni are provided guidance, counseling as well as campus interviews on the availability of job opportunities in various places. At the same time, students living in remote areas are given information about job advertisements by giving messages. The purpose of setting up the cell is to provide jobs to more and more college students. On behalf of Employment Guidance Cell, Guidance, Counseling, and Campus Interviews are organized for the passed out students regarding job opportunities available at various places. The purpose behind setting up the cell is to provide jobs to more students of the college.

#### **Campus Interview:**

- **Accommodation for Non-Teaching Staff:**

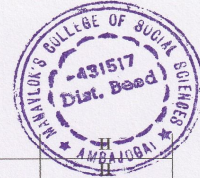
